B. The Abuse of Spiritual Gifts

2. The members were flaunting their spiritual gifts at public meetings without love for others.

So if the whole church comes together and everyone speaks in tongues, and inquirers or unbelievers come in, will they not say that you are out of your mind?

The remedy for the abuse of spiritual gifts is not to disuse these gifts, but to use them properly!

Tongue as A Private Prayer Language

¹⁴ For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my mind is unfruitful. ¹⁵ So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my understanding; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my understanding.





Tongue as A Private Prayer Language

Spirit, how can someone else, who is now put in the position of an inquirer, say "Amen" to your thanksgiving, since they do not know what you are saying? ¹⁷ You are giving thanks well enough, but no one else is edified.

Tongue as A Private Prayer Language

²⁶ In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. 27 And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.

It edifies the speaker.





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- It connects the speaker to God intimately. He is able to pray, worship and praise God effortlessly by the Holy Spirit's help.



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- It connects the speaker to God intimately. He is able to pray, worship and praise God effortlessly by the Holy Spirit's help.
- It helps the speaker to pray in accordance with God's will.
- It sharpens the speaker's spirit as he operates in the spirit realm with other spiritual gifts.

Paul Endorses the Use of Tongue as a Private Prayer Language

¹³ For this reason the one who speaks in a tongue should pray that they may interpret what they say... ²⁷ If anyone speaks in a tongue, two—or at the most three—should speak, one at a time, and someone must interpret.

Tongues, then, are a sign, not for believers but for unbelievers.

When does a tongue act as a sign to an unbeliever?





a) When a tongue as a human language is understood by the unbeliever

b) When a tongue is publicly interpreted and it becomes God's rhema to the unbeliever

²⁴ If an unbeliever or an inquirer comes in while everyone is prophesying, they are convicted of sin and are brought under judgment by all, ²⁵ as the secrets of their hearts are laid bare. So they will fall down and worship God, exclaiming, "God is really among you!"

2. The Gift of Interpretation

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It is the supernatural ability to interpret someone's tongue without having to learn the tongue.





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b. Use

When a tongue is interpreted by this gift, the unintelligible speech becomes a prophetic rhema to the listeners.





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- It is the supernatural ability to speak forth the rhema of God to the people.
- It can be foretelling about a future event .(Acts 11:27-28)
- It can also be the forth telling of God's heart and purposes for His people. (Haggai 1:3)



- ³ But the one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging and comfort.
- ⁴ Anyone who speaks in a tongue edifies themselves, but the one who prophesies edifies the church...
- ³¹ For you can all prophesy in turn so that everyone may be instructed and encouraged.

¹⁹ Do not quench the Spirit. ²⁰ Do not treat prophecies with contempt ²¹ but test them all; hold on to what is good, ²² reject every kind of evil.

E. USING THESE 3 GIFTS IN AN ORDERLY MANNER

1 CORINTHIANS 14:26-33





1 Corinthians 14:26-33

²⁶ What then shall we say, brothers and sisters? When you come together, each of you has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. Everything must be done so that the church may be built up. ²⁷ If anyone speaks in a tongue, two—or at the most three—should speak, one at a time, and someone must interpret. 28 If there is no interpreter, the speaker should keep quiet in the church and speak to himself and to God.

 Big Idea: All gifts are to be used in an orderly fashion at a worship service to build up the Body.





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- 2. Those wanting to speak aloud in tongue as part of the prophetic ministry should queue for their turns to speak. Otherwise, there should be no loud ecstatic utterances of tongues.





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- 2. Those wanting to speak aloud in tongue as part of the prophetic ministry should queue for their turns to speak. Otherwise, there should be no loud ecstatic utterances of tongues.
- 3. A maximum of 3 persons are to speak aloud in tongues. After each person has spoken in tongue, someone must interpret the tongue.

4. If there is no interpretation, the speaker must keep quiet and pray quietly to God.





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- 5. When a tongue is interpreted, it becomes a prophetic word (rhema). Those in the prophetic ministry should weigh whether this rhema is valid for the Body (1 Thessalonians 5:19-22).

- 6. This protocol is also applicable to those who wish to prophesy in their native language to the Church.

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- 2. Prophecy edifies the whole Body.





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- 4. Public Tongue + Interpretation = Prophecy





- 1. Private Tongue edifies the speaker.
- 2. Prophecy edifies the whole Body.
- 3. Prophecy > Private Tongue because it edifies a big group of people.
- 4. Public Tongue + Interpretation = Prophecy
- 5. So Public Tongue + Interpretation is as important to the Church as Prophecy
